### A Message From...



I'm always amazed by how many people feel uncomfortable praying in front of other people. I'm not amazed because I have the benefit of any special academic training on the matter. Believe it or not, prayer is not a subject in which a lot of time is dedicated for seminary education. I'm surprised because my childhood was filled with praying people. They are all with the Lord now: Marjorie, Roy, Nina, Lorena, Harold, and so many more. From my childhood I heard the prayers of these people arise in the church in which I was raised. I was amazed by these people and their humble prayers. They changed me. They changed my life.

It was their voices that convinced me of the power of prayer. There was a trust in words and an earnestness to their approach that taught me what it was to call on God in trust.

I'm amazed that more people haven't had the same experiences. I'm amazed that more people haven't had the benefit of being shaped in that way. I'm constantly surprised at how unwilling people can be to engage in public prayer, probably because they just are not aware of how POWERFUL their prayers are and can be.

If you've been wondering how to take the next step in prayer in your life, here are a few simple ways you can take the next step:

- Talk to God like you talk to anyone else. God doesn't require any special language.
- If you feel entirely lost for words, pray a psalm. As you pray each line, pause and reflect on how those words express the experiences of your life. This will begin to teach you the words of prayer.
- Be courageous! Go to a gathering of prayer (there are many listed below starting TODAY). You don't have to be brave enough to pray. Just go and listen to other people pray. Learn from them. Learn together.
- Learn to talk to God while doing other tasks. Washing the dishes?
  Develop a habit of talking to God during that regular habit as a way of remembering to talk to God regularly. The habit will form your language as well.

If I'm amazed by how uncomfortable some folks can be with prayer, it is important to say that I am in AWE of what can actually be accomplished when God's people pray. It is for this reason we are beginning a season of impetuous prayer before God! **Make sure you** 

find a time to join in one of the prayer opportunities that will be pastor-led in the weeks to come!

Make sure as well that you tune in this Sunday to gain one more item for which to pray. I'll be presenting a plan "For the Future" in all three services that comes to you from the Church Council and a couple other lay teams. It is a dream and not at all yet decided, but also a matter which deserves much prayer! We need the clarity only travailing, persistent prayer seeking the Holy Spirit's guidance can provide.

Let's be amazed and awed all together by what can happen when we pray together "For the Future!"
