At St Joe UMC and St Joe @ the Y this week has an added historical dimension. Monday night Church Conferences convened and with more than 100 in attendance 98 members of St Joe UMC voted UNANIMOUSLY to begin the For the Future Capital Campaign.



Those same voters also approved a long term use of space with Jackson Lehman YMCA UNANIMOUSLY. They approved a long term use partnership with Northeast Little League Softball with a 75% approval. A compensation package for a member of our clergy team was also approved nearly unanimously.

All of this makes what was already a historic and memorable week for St Joe UMC and St Joe @ the Y only more memorable and meaningful.

We step into the future because of what God has done in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus which we remember this week! We step into the future because the Holy Spirit still speaks, works and leads this church onward toward God's hope.




Final Call for Food Donations - This Sunday!

This week, I would love to share about a moment from Saturday night at our Komets performance! As I mentioned before, our track record of on-ice performances has been far from stellar. The thought of dancing on the ice in front of all those people in a space that large with cameras and a jumbotron near can be overwhelming. So I was nervous when I agreed to another on-ice performance this session. We had an extra rehearsal two days before this performance which really helped us prepare.
